

## From the Pastor

### *Mustard Seeds*

You know electronic devices have become a problem when you begin to see news stories about families wanting device-free vacations. More and more vacation spots and retreat centers now advertise, as a good thing, that they are off-line. They offer no Wi-Fi. And they are fully booked.

The pace of our busy lives seems ever faster, and we feel ever more tied to devices. Arthur Boers believes this is why there is such a hunger for spirituality now. He writes in his book, *Living Into Focus*, "The sense that there must be 'something more' propels quests to find better ways."

So, when we go on vacations, we do so to get away from ordinary routines, to rest, to discover new places, and to enjoy family time. How can we do that when our device use is no different than when we are home? How are we resting when work messages appear on our phones? Boers writes, "We're all good at naming the conveniences technology provides. We're not so good at recognizing its inconveniences, displacements, losses, and intrusions."

There is, indeed, a deep hunger for spirituality. Rather than being distracted, always feeling wrung out, anxious and harried, folks seek calm, peace, a renewed sense of trust that they are cared for, and a consistent sense of purpose. Spirituality helps us find these things we seek by way of what Boers calls "focal practices," which center us in what matters most, and help bind us together.

We struggle with spirituality, first, because we are weak. Why else does it take, for most of us, at least three weeks to form a good habit? As John Calvin wrote, "Our weakness is such that it needs to be supported by many aids." These aids are practices, or spiritual disciplines, like daily prayer, holy reading, service and contemplation.

Spirituality is hard also because our world so often works against us. Distractions abound. Work can be unrelenting. And there are more and more activities, good ones, that consume our time. Thus, the good can become the enemy of what is best.

Finally, despite our rugged individualism, and our cultures' nurture of that individualism, we find that none of us can really do a healthy spirituality alone. We need companions for this journey, and so many are not in a place where they want to admit that. We want spirituality to be easy and to take only a little time.

We have no trouble admitting that physical fitness is not easy. It requires exercise, a good diet, and the regular, habitual practice of each. Maybe because spirituality deals with much that is intangible, so many find it hard to face the fact that spiritual fitness, embodying a healthy spirituality, is not any easier than physical fitness. Boer writes that focal practices “take energy and effort; they make demands on us. They can be tough taskmasters as they require discipline, attention, and focus, thus helping us to grow in character. They are beyond our control or our ability to manipulate or consume.”

Yes, indeed. But hear the good news, too. Boer also writes, “Intriguingly, the skills demanded and the energy expended in focal activities increases enjoyment of those activities.” “Seek, and you shall find,” Jesus said.

Tired of being frustrated? Then embrace spiritual wisdom. The practices are ancient. They are tried and true. The invitation stands: “Taste and see.”
